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
JANA VIKAS OVER VIEW

JANA VIKAS is a secular, voluntary and non-profit making organization registered at district level under the Registration Act (SRA), vide Reg. No - 2641-39, 1991-92 on dated 6th May 1991. Again it was reregistered under IGR Cuttack, Odisha, vide Reg. No - 22276/04 of on dated 13th April 2006. It is also registered under the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA) of 1976 vide registration No, 105030001 on dated 16th 1992, Ministry of Home Affairs, New Delhi, Government of India.

In Odia language "JANA" means 'People' and "VIKAS" means 'Development'. It is evolving as capacity building organization and has also partnered with various NGOs and Govt departments and have formed consortium at different levels to address issues at District, State and National level. Presently the organization is working in 3 districts, 7 blocks, 74 Gram Panchayats and 517 villages. The focus is still on marginalized Dalit, indigenous tribes, minority and other backward communities.

The organization has clear strategic plan for the year 2018-2023. The thematic areas are Livelihood, Education, Governance, Women Empowerment and Violence against Women and Peace Building and Disaster Response. The organization has also which are providing better governance in terms of transparency and accountability. Human Resource (HR), Finance, Gender, Child Protection, Anti-Sexual Harassment, Safeguarding Disability, Environment Protection and Contingency policies are mandatory to practice by all the stakeholders associated with the organization.

Since 1988, Jana Vikas has been part of the rural communities for the sustainable livelihoods through various income generative activities. Jana Vikas's livelihood interventions have reached out to around 9906 population covering 1982 households from 517 Villages of 74 Gram Panchayats in 7 Blocks 3 Districts (Kandhamal, Gajapati and Bolangiri) in Odisha.



Revival of Millets as the Mainstream Cereal Crop



cultivation not only enhances food security but also preserves the rich agricultural heritage of the region. By encouraging the growth of these traditional crops, Jana Vikas aims to improve the livelihoods of the tribal communities, ensuring they have access to nutritious food that is deeply rooted in their cultural identity.

The initiative has also been pivotal in educating farmers about sustainable agricultural practices, helping them transition to more eco-friendly methods that boost productivity while conserving natural resources. Workshops and training sessions are regularly organized, empowering farmers with knowledge about crop rotation, organic farming, and efficient water management techniques.

Moreover, by reviving the cultivation of these ancient grains, Jana Vikas is contributing to the biodiversity of the region, fostering a resilient agro-ecosystem that can withstand climate change

It was a great opportunity for Jana Vikas since 2022 joining hands with the Odisha Millets Mission (OMM) as a facilitating agency, Jana Vikas has been implementing Millet Promotion Programme in convergence Agriculture Technology Management Agency (ATMA) at district and WASSAN. JANA VIKAS is one of the implementing partners for Block -G. Udayagiri in district Kandhamal.

To promote the tradition and culture of households in tribal district, Jana Vikas continued to focus on the promotion of cereals like millets (Finger Millets, Little Millets, Foxtail Millet), maize and local varieties of paddy. Cereal



challenges. The project has garnered positive feedback from the local communities, who are witnessing the benefits firsthand in terms of improved health and economic stability.

The collaboration with the Odisha Millets Mission continues to evolve, with future plans to expand the program to more districts, ensuring even wider impact and the preservation of tribal agricultural traditions for generations to come.



INCREASING MILLET PRODUCTION:

Finger millet can tolerate harsh conditions and provides higher nutritional cereal than rice and wheat. It can grow in areas having water scarcity or in regions with a certain risk of failure of conventional crops. Finger millet cultivation has the potential to bridge the demand and supply of food grains in resource-poor areas and therefore, system of Millet Intensification is one such approach which resulted in higher production in finger millet, contributing to the food and nutritional security of the tribal households in Kandhamal, even under extreme weather conditions.



The Project has conducted Participatory Varietal Trails (PVT) and identified 10 unique traditional unique improved varieties.

The project is driven with an objective to focus on organic products. The seeds were treated with Bija Ruta, after each weeding different

bio fertilizers are being used Jeeva Mruta, Panchatantra and during flowering bio pesticides are used. These are made by the farmers with the local available materials so that, farmers continue to remain depended on the own local products, minimizing input cost and low market dependency resulting in farmers continuing with sustainable agriculture practices.

PROMOTING HOUSEHOLD LEVEL CONSUMPTION:

- Exposure to various recipes through a process of training, food festival and campaign
- Promotion of ready to eat food with millet such as Haluwa, soup, Adisha, Kakra, Ladu, Dosa, Idli, Vada, Pokara, Upma, Cake, Muruku, mixture etc.



- Awareness building program on nutritional values of millets to different stakeholder, especially mother committee of women and child department program and school gong children
- Convergence workshop with district /block level officials for inclusion of millet in different supplementary nutrition programs by the Govt.
- Building prestige in consumption of millets through organizing cooking competition based on local culture and celebration.

MARKETING OF THE MILLET:

During Kharif marketing season of 2023-24, JANA VIKAS facilitated procurement of 1001 quintals of millets from 300 farmers on behalf of Lingagada and G. Udayagiri Lambs and later sold to Tribal Development Co- Operative Corporation of Odisha Ltd (TDCCOL) @ Rs. 37.46 per kg. During the reporting period, strategies like promotion of improved agronomic practices (System of Millet Intensification and Line Transplantation and Sowing, etc), institutional building, value addition and adopting a cluster approach which contributed to proper realization of MSP and better market linkages.



To achieve the objectives of the initiative taken by the agriculture department, the Jana Vikas team put their efforts along with Community Resource Persons (CRP) and members of CBOs and EPO. They are frequently trained by Agriculture officers and expert nominated by WASSAN.



Convergence workshop with block level officials for inclusion of millet in different supplementary nutrition programs by the Govt. Block Development officer, CDPO and

Agriculture officer –G. Udyaygiri participated in this meeting. Thresure and Pulveriser was distributed to SHGs with agreement between ATMA and SHGs to remain guardian of the millet value additions equipment.

TRAINING FARMERS ON MILLETS PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION:

JANA VIKAS is involved in training farmers on system of Millet intensifications at all the Gram Panchayats of Block – G. Udaygiri. This year the project has trained more than 500 farmers on farm and off farm on agronomics practices to increase Millet productions and sustaining farming practices.



CELEBRATING HARVEST FESTIVAL:

Once in a year farmers from all the Gram Panchayats come together to celebrate harvest festivals. They come and share best practices, dance and sings together and members the past crops which their forefathers cultivated and consumed. They were healthy and climate resilient and now the scientists have recognized it and its time to revive those crops and pass on to next generation. Chairperson – G. Udaygiri inaugurated the programs gathering of almost 500 participants, men and children across eight Gram Panchayats.



OUTCOME/IMPACT:

During the year, Jana Vikas helped 300 farmers adopt improved agronomic practice in their farm fields resulting in considerable improvement in farm productivity, consumption and marketing. The programme has invariably contributed towards behavioural changes amongst the farmers who are now showing greater interest in adopting improved agronomic methods including the use of non-pesticide manure in their farm fields.



INTEGRATED FARMING SYSTEM:

As Jana Vikas has been implementing the project “Special Programme for Promotion of Integrated Farming (SPPIF) supported by ATMA and WASSAN, during the reporting period, Jana Vikas continued to undertake multiple interventions following the Integrated Farming System (IFS) approach that ensures sustained quality production ecologically favoured technologies resulting in enhanced farm income



and reduced environment pollution. Reduced use of chemical fertilisers coupled with organic farming technique are core strategies adopted by Jana Vikas while designing the Integrated Farming interventions in the tribal pockets; and addressing diversified facets of agriculture. The IFS covers the entire spectrum of agronomic practices, horticulture intervention and applied agriculture, enterprise and value .

in addition support. Jana Vikas continued to adhere to this approach while promoting cereals, vegetables, oilseeds, pulses and other high value crops. **Intercropping has been adopted by 687 farmers in 275 hac where different varieties of vegetable were cultivated**

VEGETABLE PRODUCTION THROUGH TRELLIS MODEL:

Vegetable cultivation not only ensures supplementary nutrition at eh household level; it also serves as remunerative income generation source for the rural and tribal poor families. Vegetable acts as a key component of farm diversification strategies. *Jana Vikas has been promoting mixed cropping, intercropping, multilayer farming, etc., helping the farmers cultivate different crops like potato, cauliflower, brinjal, sweet corn, tomato, coriander, cabbage, pumpkin, bitter gourd, cow pea, chilli, cucumber, beans, etc.*



During the reporting year, a total of 200 farmers cultivated vegetables on 200 Acres of land in 4 GPs (Subarnagiri, Ora, Srirampur & Jubaguda). The farmers received Rs. 5,52,600 towards the intenteive. The intervention is believed to have curbed migration to a great extent, while adding to the quality of life and livelihoods of the tribal households of Kotagarh blocks.

PROMOTION OF ADARSHA BAGICHA/AGRO FORESTRY MODEL/KITCHEN GARDEN:



Availability of quality sapling is highly essential for successful cultivation throughout the year. Often farmers lost crops in early stages due to incidents or natural calamities like drought and scanty rains. During such circumstances the farmer did not have either sufficient time to raise new nursery, nor would they get sufficient seedlings from the fellow farmers. To address such situation Jana Vikas facilitated in establishing community nurseries across the intervention. Community

nurseries are being managed by women SHGs and nursery management committees in their respective villages.

Most of the households inhabiting the rural and tribal pockets stand grossly deprived of nutritious foods in their daily consumption. *Jana Vikas has been promoting the Kitchen Garden Programme under SPPIF and other flagship programmes, resulting the establishment of 55 Adarsha Bagicha or Kitchen Garden in its operational areas.* Though a small intervention, the kitchen gardens help provide supplementary nutritious food to the targeted households.



PROMOTION OF ADARSHA BAGICHA/AGRO FORESTRY MODEL/KITCHEN GARDEN:

In addition to agriculture, Jana Vikas nurtured small group and individual enterprises to provide alternative livelihood opportunities for landless and women. The inclusive approach aimed to empower them and create avenues for economic growth and sustainability. Interested farmers are provided Goat Shelter Construction & rearing, Poultry Night Shelter and Establishment of Indigenous Chicks Production Unit to increase their daily income.



4 GPs on persuading them to adopt improved rearing practice, facilitating technical handholding and input provisions like periodic vaccination, sanitisation, flock management, insurance, feed management and marketing.



Support for quality Fish Seed Stocking (Fingerling/Yearling) 30 farmers and support for establishment of Nao Fish Feed Mixture Unit 2, were the types of enterprises initiated and strengthened in 2023-24 for supplementing income for the family.



OUTCOME/IMPACT:

Vegetable cultivation and Livestock & Fishery has not only helped augment self-reliance among the on farm and off households, it has added numerous options to the food plates of tribal households, enhancing their nutritional security and integrated livelihood. During the year, a total 2202 farmers adopted improved integrated farming practices both Agriculture & Horticulture and Livestock & Fishery in Kotagarh block, the operational area.



Ensure Healthy Lives and Promote Well-being for all at the Ages:

Mental illness is crucial for both *individual well-being and societal health*. Mental health issues, such as anxiety, depression, and schizophrenia, can deeply impact people's lives, affecting their ability to work, form relationships, and engage in daily activities. Addressing mental illness is essential not only for improving quality of life for individuals but also for fostering a healthier, more productive society.

Addressing **mental illness in the district of Kandhamal**—a largely rural, tribal area in the state of Odisha, India—is crucial for several reasons. Kandhamal has a unique demographic, marked by its indigenous tribal communities and significant socio-economic challenges. Mental health issues are often underreported and under-treated in rural and underserved areas, and Kandhamal is no exception.



Thus, Jana Vikas has taken an initiative to address this pressing issue in the district of Kandhamal because **mental illness in Kandhamal** is vital for improving the overall health and well-being of its residents, particularly among vulnerable groups such as **tribal communities, women, and youth.** To effectively tackle mental health challenges, there is a need for **increased mental health awareness, culturally sensitive treatment, improved access to healthcare, and community engagement.**

EDUCATION: BRIDGING THE GAP




The role of Jana Vikas is to focus on helping children at the community to get supplementary education through community level tuition and protection of child right. It is done enabling learning Environment, Need-based Teachers' Training, Parent & Community Engagement

Beginning in the corridors of education, Jana Vikas adopted a lifecycle approach and extended its thematic areas of intervention by supporting family and community responsibility for the holistic growth of the children.



Children, their families and the community become the target group for Jana Vikas's activities as child education cannot be done in isolation, without ensuring the welfare of the whole family. Following the lifecycle approach, Jana Vikas has directly impacted the lives of over

200 individuals across various communities. By addressing issues such as nutrition, health care, and economic stability alongside education, Jana Vikas creates a more sustainable and holistic environment for children to thrive. businesses to create opportunities for skill development and employment, further contributing to the community's resilience and growth. Through their dedicated efforts, Jana Vikas is helping to build a brighter future for generations to come.



GENDER EQUALITY THROUGH EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN AND GIRLS:

These days, there is a global shift of migration among the youth and even children and elders to different districts and states for livelihood. As Jana Vikas has been working on prevention of trafficking in 80 villages of 4 GPs of Kandhamal district, out of 80 villages more than 1500 migrants are working in different states and out of which more than 60% of migrants are in Kerela state. It is learnt



that many of the migrants are victims of exploitation at work place, some of the girls are allured and trafficked and exploited. Often, they don't get appropriate wages and lack of labour card, they are deprived of accessing government provisions and Jana Vikas facilitates to avail the provisions.

Looking into the alarming situation, Jana Vikas's women empowerment programme, initiated reached out to the marginalized and socially-excluded women with interventions in nutrition, health care and livelihood. Jana Vikas' initiatives are not only focused on the livelihood of women but their protection from trafficking, abuses, POCSO Act and domestic violence.

One of the major interventions on gender equality, Jana Vikas has been addressing the emerging issues like trafficking, domestic violence, child abuses, child labour, etc in the district. Jana Vikas could secure communities from human trafficking in eighty villages in district Kandhamal, Odisha by developing network with media, police, line department, rescue and rehabilitation. The project also facilitated communities to access livelihood and social security schemes from the government.



Assessment was conducted to understand the current context of the 80 villages. We analysed on the status of migrants digitally for the first time and understood that, most of our community members have migrated to Kerala and later found that, people consider this state safer than other. The cases of trafficking have increased recently in comparison to earlier despite increasing communication facilities and literacy. The team found it very much difficult to get address of many migrants. Almost everyone has experienced exploitation such as work without or inadequate wages for months together. Girls are mostly forced to work as domestic mostly exploited in many ways. Film called "UDHAAR" means "To Save" is the product of Jana Vikas screened at 80

villages of 4 blocks of Kandhamal further helped the communities especially women, elderly and children to understand about trafficking and how to prevent.

Exposure visit of trafficking team to migrants' destination point Kerala

With the migrants in Kerala during the exposure visit and Jana Vikas played vital role in bridging the gap between source and destination point in case of trafficking, abuses, exploitation and death. Their efforts focused on providing support and resources to



vulnerable communities, ensuring that individuals were informed of their rights and had access to the help they needed. By collaborating with local authorities, NGOs, and community leaders, Jana Vikas worked tirelessly to create safer environments and promote awareness about the risks associated with migration.

Workshops and educational programs were organized, empowering migrants with knowledge about legal channels and protective measures. These initiatives also emphasized the importance of community vigilance and solidarity, encouraging people to look out for one another. Through these collective efforts, a network of support was established, fostering hope and resilience among those who had embarked on their journeys in search of better opportunities.

Jana Vikas's dedication not only helped to mitigate immediate risks but also contributed to long-term solutions.

The great deal of focus of Jana Vikas was place on promoting sustainable agriculture in the operational areas of the organization through promotion of resilient crops and traditional agriculture practices. Emphasis was given to ensuring crop diversification and climate resilience seeds. Thus, Jana Vikas promotes Seed Bank at Surubali Cultural Center and from where farmers take the required traditional seeds to promote and cultivate the climate resilience seeds for their livelihood.





As like other costal districts, Kandhamal is also victim of natural calamities like cyclone, flash flood, lightning and landslide, Jana Vikas is fortunate to implement the Disaster response through the District Emergency Unit, Kandhamal through Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDOMA). Jana Vikas was engaged in awareness at 50 villages of Kotagarh and Tumbudiband blocks of Kandhamal

district. Village Development Management Plan (VDMP) and Gram Panchayat Development Management Plan (GPVDMP) groups are formed to prevent and manage the disaster at the most vulnerable areas.

These groups work tirelessly to educate the community on disaster preparedness, ensuring that each household understands the steps to take before, during, and after a natural disaster. Workshops and training sessions are organized regularly, focusing on emergency response tactics, first aid, and effective communication strategies to minimize chaos during emergencies.

Moreover, Jana Vikas collaborates with local schools, integrating disaster management into the curriculum to instill a sense of responsibility and knowledge in the younger generation. By empowering these communities with the right tools and information, they aim to build resilience and reduce the impact of future calamities.



Seed Preservation.

As there is a treat to the preservation and promotion of traditional seeds in the villages, Jana Vikas takes some initiative to promote the preservation of traditional seeds and encourage farmers to cultivate and promote them. The long age traditional sees are slowly vanishing and many are already disappeared. These seeds are climate resilience and environmental, cultural, economic, and biodiversity



aspects. Traditional seed preservation is vital for sustaining biodiversity, ensuring food security, promoting sustainable farming practices, and protecting cultural heritage. It is an essential component of maintaining resilient agricultural systems in the face of modern challenges such as climate change, economic instability, and the homogenization of food systems.

PARTNERSHIP FOR DEVELOPMENT

OUR PARTNERS:

Jana Vikas believes in partnership to achieve our organizational vision. Our partnership model aims to share the knowledge, expertise, best practices to promote learning in larger communities. We also consider the partnership as the space for learning. Working in a partnership approach helps in promoting accountability among different stakeholder towards the collective efforts in improving the quality of life of marginalized and vulnerable communities of our target areas. Jana Vikas has implemented its programs in villages across districts in partnership with community – based organizations and Local and National NGOs, International agencies and Local Government Institutions and departments.

PARTNERING WITH COMMUNITIES:

Jana Vikas has implemented its programs in **547 villages across 3 districts** in partnership with community – based organizations (Anganwadi, ASHA, Health Center, School Management Committees, Producer Groups, SHGs, Forest Management Committees, Community Vigilance Group, CBO, EPO, Cooperative Societies, Block Child Protection Committee and Phulbani Action Group) at village and block level.

PARTNERING WITH GOVERNMENT:

Jana Vikas is a member of the District Taskforce Child Protection Committee, and District Disaster Protection Committee. As Jana Vikas has been implementing government support programs like Odisha Shree Anna Abhiyan and Special Program for Promotion of Integrated Farming, WASSAN, it has been working closely with Chief District Agriculture Office-cum-PD-ATMA, District Emergency Response through OSDMA and facilitating Capacity Building Program from State Institute for Rural Development and Panchayat Raj (SIRD & PR).

CAPACITY BUILDING:

JANA VIKAS conducted capacity building on the undertaken activities by the organization during the reporting year 2023-2024 like Farmers' Producer Companies, CBOs and CSO. Based on the findings, a series of capacity building programme and awareness campaigns were organized for multiple stakeholders like key farmers, WSHGs, Prod-



ucer Groups, Leaders, Community Resource Persons, Education Committee, Community Health Committee, Community Vigilance Committee for protection of Trafficking in multifaceted thematic areas such as producer groups, governance, agronomic practices, improved farm practice, adoption of NTFP, value addition of agro-commodities, enterprise

promotion, awareness on Prevention of Trafficking, Person with Mental Illness, Quality Education to parents, Child Rights, Women Rights, Child Marriage, Labour Act, PRI members and different stakeholders like MBKs, CRPs under Odisha Livelihood Mission (OLM). These initiatives aim to create a more informed and empowered community by addressing critical social issues and promoting sustainable development. By focusing on education and awareness, the goal is to equip individuals and communities with the knowledge and tools they need to protect their rights and improve their quality of life.






